To express himself and his opinions, this is done often through art, open language, which today is more varied than ever before.



In their joint work, Rit Lomo and Nike Adler for the first time created a stream of images and phrases that connect each other's works, mixing them and give space to confuse each other.

By allowing elements from the traditional painting session scenic photographs, they create together different (pictorial) language, new forms of expression and content.
